Planning Commission Reports – Vernita Saylor stated the motion, seconded by Mike Harris, to approve Planning Commission minutes and permit applications except conditional use permit. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Mike Harris, Nora McGowen and Kevin Banzhaf; absent and not voting was John Kutnink and Jeff Ommert. Motion carried unanimously by City Council members present.

Utility Supervisor Report – Dave Houghtelling reported generators were ran and went from three megawatts to four megawatts without any issues. The contract with NPPD with increase the kilowatt hours and the city would receive approximately. Mike Tomlin passed his wastewater certification. Dave brought up again hiring someone for the Utility Supervisor positions as he is retiring in February 2024. Dave received mower quotes from John Deere and would like to budget for new mower. There is still \$15,000.00 in the 2022-2023 for a mower. Dave would like to purchase a 2023 Z950RXTRACK mower in the amount of \$14,500. Vernita Saylor stated the motion, seconded by Kevin Banzhaf, to approve purchasing a 2023 Z950RXTRACK mower in the amount of \$14,500.00. Voting yes were Vernita Saylor, Mike Harris, Nora McGowen and Kevin Banzhaf; absent and not voting was John Kutnink and Jeff Ommert. Motion carried unanimously by City Council members present.

City Clerk/Treasurer Report – Courtney Stanton included sales tax distribution for what was paid in July 2023 and financial statements for the period ending June 30, 2023. Included was renewal for health insurance. There will be a 10% increase in health insurance this year. Courtney will ask Steve Johnson to see to come to the next city council meeting to review health insurance policy renewal.

New Business:

A. Joyce Deaver was present to request an annual local match for Tri Valley Public Transportation. Based upon Tri Valley Ridership, Cambridge was said to be 18% of trips, based on trips not mileage. Joyce reported 75% of funding comes from federal funding and the remainder comes from state funding and local match. Joyce also reported that they are looking to expand with another van and driver as they are not able to keep up with the continued growth due to the current demands. Last year the City of Cambridge local match funding was in the amount of \$5841.00. This year Tri Valley Public Transportation is requesting a local match in the amount of \$12,470.00. Match request will be discussed at the budget workshop.
